

Clinical Research Fellowship in Addiction, Concurrent Psychiatric and/or Medical Disorders: Tobacco Addiction

Dr. Selby is seeking an MD with either an independent license or eligible for an educational license through the CPSO for a one-year Clinical Research fellowship starting January 1, 2023 and ending December 31, 2023. This position is an opportunity for an eligible physician to develop skills in clinical, educational and or implementation science research working with a multidisciplinary team of scientists (genetics, imaging, clinical trials, epidemiology, quantitative/qualitative, educational), physicians (family medicine, psychiatry, public health) and other health care providers.

The Fellow will be based in the Addiction Division's Nicotine Dependence Clinic at CAMH treating people with complex tobacco use disorder. There is a requirement to support ongoing trials and other projects (tobacco, opioid, alcohol, depression, health behaviours and or in technology enabled collaborative care/automation of clinical care using algorithms, chatbots, apps). The exact focus will depend on mutually agreed upon learning needs that align with CANMEDs roles (https://www.cfpc.ca/en/education-professional-development/educational-frameworks-and-reference-guides/canmeds-family-medicine OR http://www.royalcollege.ca/rcsite/canmeds/canmeds-framework-e) and the qualifications and interests of the candidate.

Prerequisites:

Prerequisites for the fellowship position include either certification by the College of Family Physicians of Canada or the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada or equivalent and license to practice in Ontario.

International graduates will need to have passed at least the MCCEE and TOEFL or equivalent and be eligible for an educational license through the CPSO.

Graduate training (MSc/MA, PhD) is an asset but not mandatory.

Remuneration

There is a stipend of \$60,000 per annum. For those physicians with an independent license to practice in Ontario and able to bill OHIP for clinical services, a blended model of remuneration will be considered.
